Lesson 3	To explore Arcimboldo's representations of the four elements.	Children to explore and learn about Arcimboldo's four elements paintings. They will think about what items have been used to represent each element before recreating their own elements picture using items provided. Lesson 4	To select, arrange and use flowers to make portraits.	Children to focus on Arcimbolo's Flora painting and the flowers used to represent different facial features. Lesson 5	To use sketching and painting skills to create animal portraits.	Children to explore Arcimboldo's Earth, Water, Air and The Cook paintings, and decide what they have in common. They will create animal pictures through sketching using basic shapes and simple lines then using paint or pastels to add colour, pattern and texture.	<ul> <li>Can the children use basic shapes and simple lines to sketch animals?</li> <li>Can the children select and apply paint effectively in terms of colour, pattern and texture?</li> <li>Can the children talk about their work and compare it to the work of Arcimboldo?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Slides</li> <li>Worksheet 5A/5B/5C/5D</li> <li>Picture Cards A/B/C</li> <li>Paints and paintbrushes</li> <li>Oil pastels (FSD? activity only)</li> </ul>
Lesson 6	To make appropriate decisions when selecting objects and images.	Children to explore Arcimboldo's <i>The Jurist</i> and <i>The Librarian</i> paintings and the symbolic items used in them. They will evaluate everything they have learnt about Arcimboldo before recreating their own self-portrait using items that are important to them or may represent them.	<ul> <li>Can the children make decisions about which items to include in their self-portrait?</li> <li>Can the children describe the differences and similarities between the work of Arcimboldo and their own?</li> <li>Can the children describe the differences and similarities between the work of Arcimboldo and another artist?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Slides</li> <li>Worksheet 6A/6B</li> <li>Challenge Cards A/B</li> <li>Pencils and colouring pencils</li> <li>A variety of magazines and catalogues, glue and scissors (FSD? activity only)</li> </ul>
